

RULES FOR POLYTUNNELS

- Permission must be obtained from GAS before purchasing and erecting a polytunnel
- The polytunnel must not be larger than:
 - 6m x 3m x 2m on a plot 5 rods or more **OR**
 - 3m x 2m x 2m on smaller plots
- It must be placed at one end of your plot and not in the centre; you must check that neighbouring plots are not shaded and your site warden must confirm the positioning is acceptable
- It must make allowance for rainwater fall off so that it does not drain on to neighbouring plots
- The ground may have to be leveled to ensure the polytunnel lies secure but please do not dig out or pile up the soil such that the base is a different height from the rest of the plot.
- No permanent fixings are to be used (e.g. concrete for foundations).
- The polytunnel must be maintained in a good state of repair at all times. Ripped plastic covering must be removed immediately and not allowed to blow on to other plots or adjacent property or roads.
- When you vacate your plot, you may wish to offer the polytunnel for sale to the incoming tenant at a mutually agreed price but failing this it is your responsibility to remove it and all its contents completely from the site. If you do not, you may be charged for its removal.
